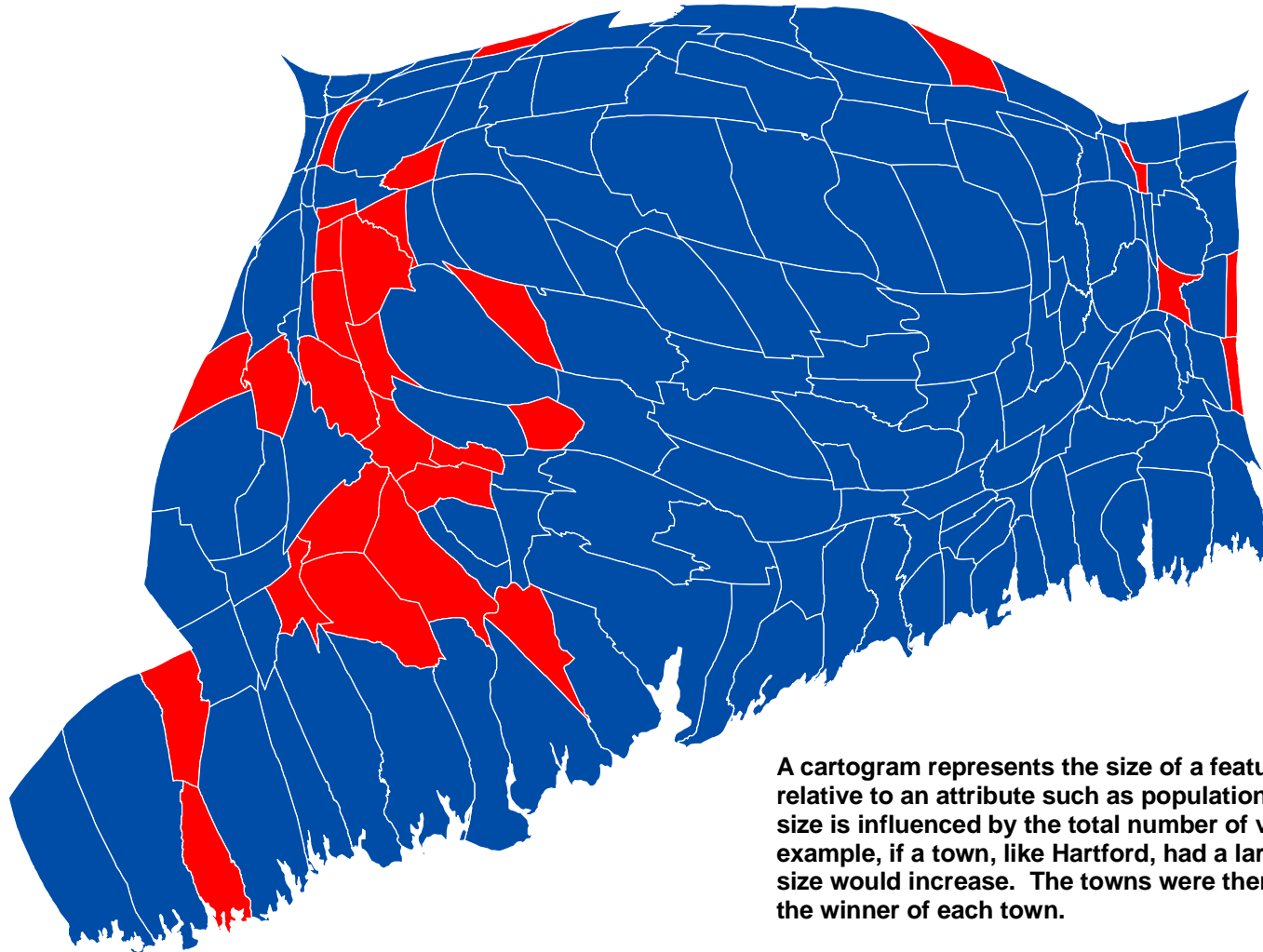


Connecticut Election 2008 Cartogram

A cartogram represents the size of a feature on a map, like a town, relative to an attribute such as population. In this map each town's size is influenced by the total number of votes in that town. For example, if a town, like Hartford, had a large number of votes its size would increase. The towns were then symbolized based on the winner of each town.

Election data were provided by the Associated Press. Cartogram methodology developed by Mark Newman and Michael Gastner at the University of Michigan and cartogram software provided by ESRI.
